

MLLLC PROGRAMS

The MLLLC programs aim to support and empower First Nations youth through leadership and educational opportunities, encouraging school engagement and personal growth for every young person. The MLLLC programs are delivered to a vast number of communities across the Northern Territory, with the support of MACC Road Safety, INPEX, Intract, and the NT Department of Education.

Through two-way learning, students explore MLLLC values of Standing Strong (Leadership), Feeling Good (Wellbeing), and One Mob (Community & Connections).

Consistent and meaningful engagement with schools, students and families, has meant our young people are able to determine their own lives and explore their own ideas of success.

Two Way Learning
Exploring Indigenous Success
On Country & Residential





In 2023, MLLLC programs will offer the *Make Your Mark* program for year 6 students (10-13 years old). This program will incorporate On Country learning in NT remote communities and a residential component held at the Michael Long Learning and Leadership Centre in Darwin.

The Make Your Mark program explores themes of leadership, wellbeing and community, and uses elements of AFL to enhance engagement and success for each student.

Students will engage in curriculum which focuses on:

- · Making good choices
- · Health and wellbeing
- Literacy and numeracy
- Teamwork
- · Creative arts
- · Goal mapping
- Hands on learning
- Strong relationships and connections

What it looks like:

- 15 weeks flexible
- On Country (community engagement) and Residential Darwin
- Strength-based programming
- AFL Certified curriculum
- Curriculum that incorporates cultural learnings and safety
- Students aged 10-13
- 10 20 students students chosen based on high attendance and positive engagement/ behaviour in school (directed by school)
- Engagement with teachers and students' family - building strong relationships for greater student success

*Please note, our programs are funded for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students only.

RESIDENTIAL

The Make your Mark program is targeted to students aged 10 - 13 years and encompasses a 15-week community-based leadership program and a one-week residential program at the MLLLC.

The program includes:

- Refined boarding school experience (residential)
- Enhancing leadership skills
- Building new relationships and new learnings with local organisations and businesses
- New experiences and opportunities
- Curriculum incorporating AFL themed literacy and numeracy
- Focus on student wellbeing and personal development
- AFL Certified curriculum
- AFL player/club knowledge, voices and mentoring

Our core content is aligned to the National Australian Education Curriculum.

Pre/Post Residential Program

- Teacher resources AFL / Leadership content and activities
- Engagement with AFL Players and Clubs

RESIDENTIAL PROGRAM (DARWIN)

- One-week
- Excursions and experiences
- Relationship building local Darwin/NT organisations

Who?

- 10-20 students (male and female)
- Teacher(s) and Assistant Teacher(s)
- AFLNT RDMs or community member

Program Costs

- Student: \$850 (covered by MLLLC)
- Staff: \$500 (covered by MLLLC)
- *includes accommodation, meals, student wellbeing, excursions, MLLLC uniform

Travel

WHAT IT LOOKS LIKE

Over 15 weeks, students will engage with various activities that incorporate MLLLC values through the work with the AFL (including AFL clubs and players), AFLNT Remote Development Managers (RDMs), and MLLLC Program staff.

- Darwin boarding house visits Haileybury, St Johns College
- Educational activities numeracy, literacy and wellbeing aligned with Australian National Education curriculum
- AFL themed leadership initiatives
- Leadership activities scavenger hunts at MLLLC and Darwin city, public speaking, leadership qualities - in community, on the field, at school
- AFLNT Game Development footy skills and game focus
- Umpiring learning new skills
- Elite AFL training programs supported by AFL clubs and AFLNT NT Thunder Academy to learning standards of elite athletes
- Living away from home activities to strengthen mindset and personal development to counteract homesickness and learnings to live away from home
- Students learn new skills, connections and ways to navigate living in two worlds
- Working together Parliament house and NTEC, local Aboriginal organisations, Surf Live Saving NT and more
- Experiences beach, water park, Casuarina Shopping Centre, Kingpin, Darwin Waterfront and more
- Wellbeing focus Leadership, mindset, healthy eating and cooking, wellness sessions

ON COUNTRY COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

- Intensive On Country program incorporating Education, Leadership and AFL
 - MLLLC Staff fly into community
 - Based in local school
 - One week (flexible)
- RDM Additional support Consistent engagement and on-ground support from community based AFLNT Remote Development Managers (RDMs)
 - AFL and MLLLC leadership sessions run by RDMs
 - Student mentorship supporting student engagement in school and positive behaviour
 - Out of school sessions footy skills and relationship building
- AFL Player Mentorship video yarns and community/school support
- Resources for teachers provided by MLLLC
- Access to AFL Schools Teacher Resources (aligned with National Curriculum) - footy skills, leadership, wellbeing, numeracy and literacy
 - Lesson plans, worksheets, reflections and surveys
- Engagement and support for families
 - MLLLC Staff and RDMs working with families and community organisations to help increase student attendance and personal development for all
